
The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) reminds us that "The Christian who unites his own death to that of Jesus views it as a step towards him and an entrance into everlasting life." CCC 1020 This faith in the Resurrection of Jesus is central to a Christian's hope of life beyond this life. Christ has been raised, and because of that, we believe that we, as we live our lives in union with His, will be raised also. Saint Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead came also through a human being. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, ..." 1 Corinthians 15:20-22
