



## GOD'S CALL TO US

"God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. For this reason, at every time and in every place, God draws close to man. He calls man to seek him, to know him, to love him with all his strength." *Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)* <sup>1</sup>

"Those who with God's help have welcomed Christ's call and freely responded to it are urged on by love of Christ to proclaim the Good News everywhere in the world. This treasure, received from the apostles, has been faithfully guarded by their successors. All Christ's faithful are called to hand it on from generation to generation, by professing the faith, by living it in fraternal sharing, and by celebrating it in liturgy and prayer.<sup>6</sup>" CCC <sup>3</sup>

"Incorporated into Christ by Baptism, Christians are 'dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus' and so participate in the life of the Risen Lord.<sup>8</sup> Following Christ and united with him,<sup>9</sup> Christians can strive to be 'imitators of God as beloved children, and walk in love'<sup>10</sup> by conforming their thoughts, words and actions to the 'mind ... which is yours in Christ Jesus,'<sup>11</sup> and by following His example.<sup>12</sup>" CCC 1694
