

#### DEATH, JUDGEMENT, RESURRECTION

#### "The meaning of Christian death

Because of Christ, Christian death has a positive meaning: 'For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.' The saying is sure: if we have died with him, we will also live with him.' What is essentially new about Christian death is this: through Baptism, the Christian has already 'died with Christ' sacramentally, in order to live a new life; and if we die in Christ's grace, physical death completes this 'dying with Christ' and so completes our incorporation into him in his redeeming act:

It is better for me to die in (eis) Christ Jesus than to reign over the ends of the earth. Him it is I seek - who died for us. Him it is I desire - who rose for us. I am on the point of giving birth . . . . Let me receive pure light; when I shall have arrived there, then shall I be a man. <sup>578</sup>" Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1010

"The resurrection of all the dead, 'of both the just and the unjust,'623 will precede the Last Judgment. "In the presence of Christ, who is Truth itself, the truth of each man's relationship with God will be laid bare. The Last Judgment will reveal even to its furthest consequences the good each person has done or failed to do during his earthly life..." CCC 1039

"The Last Judgment will come when Christ returns in glory. Only the Father knows the day and the hour; only he determines the moment of its coming. Then through his Son Jesus Christ he will pronounce the final word on all history. We shall know the ultimate meaning of the whole work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation and understand the marvellous ways by which his Providence led everything towards its final end. The Last Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death. 628" CCC 1040

"The message of the Last Judgment calls men to conversion while God is still giving them 'the acceptable time, . . . the day of salvation.'629 It inspires a holy fear of God and commits them to the justice of the Kingdom of God. It proclaims the 'blessed hope' of the Lord's return, when he will come 'to be glorified in his saints, and to be marvelled at in all who have believed.'630" CCC 1041


